

General Info:

Register today for only \$15 per scout, \$5 for adults. Registration ends April 30th.

Medical:

Current Parts A&B medical form with parent signatures required for all attendees. Be sure all inoculations are up to date.

If you have any scouts or scouters that have an allergy to any foods or insect bites please provide a list at medical check in and include if they use an Epi Auto-Injector and who in your troop is trained to use it. Medications will be held by the troop following their own troop plan.

Campfire:

Each unit should plan to prepare one skit, song or cheer to be performed on Saturday Night. Come to the campfire rehearsed and ready to perform. Skits will count for overall scoring of the camporee, and should be theme based for extra points.

Webelos:

Webelos are encouraged to attend as guests of your Troop. There are however some stipulations:

1. Your troop is responsible for the care and feeding of Webelos.
2. Webelos MUST camp with a parent.
3. Webelos pay the normal \$15 per person fee (parent is free). Please make arrangements with any day tripping Webelos to meet at your site. There will not be anyone at registration on Saturday to meet with incoming scouts.

Wristbands will be given to each troop at check in for day trippers and late arrivals.

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Dessert competition:

After dinner, and preceding the campfire, units should deliver a dessert to Hayden Hall for judging. Submissions are judged on taste, presentation and adherence to the theme.

Campsite Entranceway:

Units are encouraged to build entrances to their campsites, and doing so can add to their overall score. Entrances will be judged based on aesthetics, structural integrity and adherence to the theme.

Campsite Inspection:

Units will be judged on the order and cleanliness of their campsites. Camporee staff will make random visits during the day Saturday to inspect the sites.

General Instructions:

Check in:

Units will check-in in the main parking lot on Friday evening. It is expected that all troops will be checked in and ready to participate in time for the opening ceremony on Saturday morning at 8:30am

Check Out:

Before a unit may leave on Sunday, it must check out with the administrative staff. All units should attempt to be ready to leave camp Sunday morning by 11am. Each campsite will be inspected, and are expected to be in the condition they were found.

Meals and Food Supplies:

Units are responsible for the preparation of all meals, to be eaten in their campsites.

Parking:

Parking of all cars will be at the direction of camporee staff. No cars may remain in camp unless specifically approved by staff.

Trailers:

Trailers must be placed off the road and detached from any vehicles. Units are responsible for the securing of gear, and should be kept generally closed and tidy.

Accidents:

All accidents must be reported to the EMT who will be serving on staff.

Religious Services:

Religious services will held on Saturday evening. The location of services will be announced at the Friday evening cracker barrel.

Uniforms:

Field uniforms should be worn during religious ceremonies and at all ceremonies.

Attendance:

Once checked in, all units and individuals must remain in camp. The administrative staff must be directly notified if anyone must leave camp.
